Protocols for NZPF Conference 2018 Powhiri at Pipitea Marae

Tuesday 23 October 2018

By 3pm all manuhiri must assemble at the gates to Pipitea Marae, Thorndon Quay.

Women are to be at the front for the start of the karanga and move forward, with men behind. One of our women will reply with the kaikaranga.

Approximately halfway across the courtyard towards the whare nui, the women are to slow down and allow the men to move forward to encircle the women. (This follows Taranaki kawa and is a response to tradition following events at Parihaka).

At the whare, all are to remove shoes.

Our male leaders and VIPs will enter the whare first and proceed to hongis with tangata whenua who will be positioned to the right inside the whare. Men will then proceed to the seats situated on the left (speakers and VIPs to sit in chairs placed facing Taranaki whanau).

ALL visitors (men first) are to follow in line after the leading men and hongis with tangata whenua and then be seated in the remaining seats on the left.

Speaking Order:

- Karepa Wall (Taranaki whanau) followed by waiata
- Hata Temo (NZPF kaumatua) followed by waiata – Taku rakau e
- Karepa Wall

The floor will be opened to English speakers:

- President Whetu Cormick will introduce Hon Grant Robertson, Minister for the Arts and Culture
- Hon Grant Robertson

Karepa Wall will perform a karakia kai at the close of these speeches.

All will proceed to the dining area for afternoon tea.

The powhiri will conclude at 5pm and buses will depart for evening events promptly.

Dress Code:

Taranaki whanau follows a traditional kawa and they will all be dressed in black, with the women in skirts. Please respect their kawa and wear black or subdued colours if possible. Women preferably in skirts below/on the knee, although we recognize that other events follow this which may call for trousers. Tangata whenua would rather that women wear trousers and attend, than not attend at all.

Sensible shoes that can be taken off easily are recommended. If the afternoon is wet, umbrellas and coats are recommended.
